





STUDENT ENDOWMENT FUND

The East Muskingum Student Endowment Fund promotes student excellence for all students in East Muskingum Schools by providing financial support for specific activities beyond the basic curriculum and/or beyond the financial resources of the East Muskingum Board of Education. Since its inception in 1983, the Endowment Fund has supported over \$237,000 of enrichment activities for students.

Along with providing monies for special projects requested by our East Muskingum staff, the East Muskingum Student Endowment manages applications and selection processes for 13 scholarships housed under the East Muskingum Endowment Fund at the Muskingum County Community Foundation.

The balance of the Student Endowment Fund as of April 2023 was \$612,643.00. Last year, \$11,494.00 was approved for spending from the interest earned on the general account invested through the Muskingum County Community Foundation. In addition to these monies, the Student Endowment Board applied for a grant through the Fellers Foundation and received \$8,500 to add for funding projects.

These funds help with the following on-going programs: Underground Railroad tour, Patriotic presentation & Park Trip, Stem Lab, JGHS Author presentation, K-2 PAX incentives, Momma Mia Musical, Chalk on the Walk, Poetry Out Loud, Paving the Way West, Resident Outdoor Education, and the 8th Grade Washington, D.C. trip. Other projects are approved throughout the school year as teachers apply for assistance with classroom projects and activities.

School Resource Officer

East Muskingum Schools partners with the Muskingum County Sheriff's Office to provide a Deputy/School Resource Officer (SRO) who is on duty everyday throughout the school year. Deputy Tanner Morton, a JGHS graduate and community member, currently serves in this role for East Muskingum Schools.



Below is a list of his primary responsibilities:

- Train and lead all building safety drills
- Patrol school zones during arrival and departure times
- Visible and interactive with students and staff throughout the day
- Provide legal/law enforcement as necessary
- Assist with truancy issues
- Provide security at large group events athletic games, dances, and graduation
- Lead various grade level educational (sexting/safety) sessions that are coordinated with principals and teachers

The East Muskingum Board of Education meets the second Thursday of the month at 4:00 p.m. Parents and residents are cordially invited to attend Board meetings. Anyone who has items for the agenda should contact David Adams, Superintendent of Schools, at (740) 826-7655 a week prior to the meeting.

The East Muskingum Board of Education in compliance with the "Sunshine Law" conducts all of its business at a public meeting and deals with only property concerns or personnel matters in executive sessions if necessary.

The East Muskingum Board of Education's major function is policy making in nature. It formulates operating policies concerning employment of all personnel, pupil personnel, educational programs, finance, building programs, instructional materials and public relations. The Board employs administrators who are charged with the responsibility to operate the schools within the limits of Board policy and state statutes.

Many questions or concerns on the part of parents, students or residents may be resolved by contacting the appropriate administrative office. We encourage your personal contact in order to better serve the students of the local district. The East Muskingum School Directory - on the back page - may be of assistance to you when making contact about your question or concern.

This system is used to communicate weather-related cancellations, delays, early dismissals, various building and district announcements and upcoming district events. To ensure that our Automated Parent Communication System is functioning properly and that we have the most up-to-date contact numbers for all our students, parents need to make sure that any contact information is always current. Contact your child's school secretary with any changes, including emergency contact list phone numbers and numbers you do not want called. If you have any questions, please contact the office of the building in which your child attends school.

EMERGENCY SCHOOL CLOSINGS • • • • • • •

East Muskingum Schools will attempt to maintain a normal school schedule whenever possible. When it becomes evident that the safety and well being of students cannot be assured, schools will be closed. As soon as a decision is made to close schools, it will be announced on the following radio and TV stations: WHIZ AM/FM and TV; WILE; WYBZ 107.3; WBNS 10 TV; ABC 6/Fox 28 and WCMH 4 NBC TV. Decisions will be made as soon as possible; however, most closings will not occur until early morning. Stay tuned to a local radio/TV station for emergency announcements - they provide a real community service. You can also follow East Muskingum Schools on Facebook @eastmuskingum for updates on closings and delays.

To ensure a strong educational program is maintained, make-up days will be scheduled as needed. February 19, March 18, and May 7 will be a make-up day if five calamity days have been used prior to that date. Additional days will be added to the end of the school year beginning May 24 and continue in successive days. This calendar is subject to change with any Board of Education, State Department of Education, gubernatorial action, or legislative direction of the Ohio General Assembly.

Students in kindergarten through grade twelve will be evaluated during four nine-week marking periods. Students in grades 3, 4, and 5 will receive letter grades while students in kindergarten and grades 1 and 2 will receive progress reports. Closing dates for the nine-week periods are October 20, January 12, March 15, and May 23. Conference days have been scheduled during the school year for teachers to communicate progress and concerns verbally with parents. Check the calendar for specific building dates.

TRANSPORTATION

- Our District covers 192 square miles.
- Our buses travel approximately 2,100 miles every day to cover 80 routes.
- We provided transportation to ten different school buildings last year.
- We have 19 regular bus drivers, 8 substitute bus/van drivers, 1 mechanic, 1 mechanic helper, and 1 supervisor.
- We have 26 buses in our fleet to cover routes, trips, and to use for spares.
- Transportation now has its own "one call system" to alert parents/guardians as needed.

Pickup & Drop-off Times:

- Times are "approximate" and will vary from day to day.
- Several factors cause "time changes" traffic, number of students riding or not riding, weather/road conditions, substitute drivers, and mechanical issues with the bus.
- Be "patient" as our drivers provide safe travels for each student to and from school.







Remember to STOP for a bus that is picking up or dropping off students.

When you are approaching a bus from the front or rear on roads with three lanes or less. On roads with four lanes or more, you need to STOP only if approaching the rear of the bus.

SOME SAFETY TIPS FOR OUR STUDENTS

- Be at the bus stop "5 MINUTES" before the bus is scheduled to arrive.
- Never try to "CHASE DOWN" a bus.
- Stay out of the "DANGER ZONE" which is the space 10 feet around the bus.
- "ALWAYS LOOK" to the driver before crossing in front of the bus.
- "NO EATING or DRINKING" on the bus. This includes chewing gum.
- Always "STAY SEATED" while the bus is moving.
- Do not bring any "DANGEROUS SUBSTANCES" on the bus.

INTRA-DISTRICT OPEN ENROLLMENT

In accordance with state law (ORC 3313.97), the East Muskingum Board of Education has established an intra-district open enrollment policy. The policy applies to the elementary schools.

The Board of Education believes that whenever possible, students should be permitted to attend the school building of their choice within the District. Therefore, students shall be allowed to attend any school of their choice on a first come, first served basis depending on the number of eligible openings, class size, building enrollment, etc.

Students within a designated attendance area shall have priority in registering in that school. Students may apply for open enrollment in a school outside their attendance area. Such applications shall be approved if there is space available in the classes in the requested school and the application has been submitted on or before five school days prior to the start of school in accordance with the regulation accompanying this policy. Applications will be acted upon and all applicants will be notified no later than the Thursday before the first student day of school.

INTER-DISTRICT OPEN ENROLLMENT

The East Muskingum Board of Education approved open enrollment for the 2023-24 school year. The Ohio legislature enables school boards to make the annual decision of whether to remain open or closed to non-resident student enrollment. We believe that we have been able to adequately assimilate additional students without adversely affecting our pupil teacher ratio and student achievement. This ratio is monitored on a yearly basis and if a grade level is over the prescribed limit, it is closed to additional open enrollment students.

The annual application period for open enrollment occurs during March, and families are notified of their status prior to the beginning of the following school year. Families applying for open enrollment must provide all information required on the application and once accepted must register their child at the appropriate school building. Additionally, they will be required to follow all procedures defined in the Board's open enrollment policy. Anyone applying after the deadline may be considered based upon our "native" district enrollment and on a first come, first served basis. 

The East Muskingum School District operates six cafeterias which meet the USDA nutrient standards for breakfast and lunch service for all students. A staff of 21 members serves the students of East Muskingum Schools. Staff members have completed the ServSafe training appropriate for thier area of expertise.

East Muskingum Schools receive reimbursement from the naitional School Lunch and School Breakfast Programs through the Ohio Department of Education-Child Nutrition Programs for all meals serves. Full price lunch meals range from \$2.80-\$3.00 for students with reduced price lunch measl costing \$0.40. Breakfast meals are \$2.25 with reduced priced meals being \$0.30. ALL FAMILIES are encouraged to complete the meal application at the beginning of the school year to see if they qualify for free or reduced meals and subsequently school fee waivers. Applications may be completed for review at any time a family experiences a change in financial situations.

All students are encouraged to begin their day with breakfast in all cafeteria settings. The student breakfast consists of fruits, grains, and milk. Hot and cold breakfast items are offered for students. During the 2022-2023 school year, approximately 56,813 breakfast meals were served to students. For lunch, students have a variety of vegetables, fruits, grains, meat/meat alternative, and fluid milk available through hot meal options. Over 195,030 lunch meals were served in our cafeteria settings during this school year.

Each cafeteria has a Point of Sale system in which students punch in their individualized PIN number. The Point of Sale system records the meal purchase by student so that parents may monitor their child's eating habits. If you would like additional information concerning the items the child is selecting, you may call the school and request to speak with the school cashier. Parents may place money in their child's account for the purchase of a la carte items, extra milk, and additional meal items they may desire to have for their breakfast and/or lunch. Online account payments may be made via the PaySchools link: https://payschoolscentral.com/.

Families are responsible for the meal debt incurred during a student's school career. Parents are encouranged to check the balance of the meal account and add funds to cover the itmes their child eats at school. Meal debt carries over into the next school year and parents will be responsible prior to a child's school trnascripts and records being provided at graduation and when transferring to another schooldistrict. Questrions regarding meal charges may be directed to the building Head Cook or the Food Service Director at the East Muskingum Schools District Office.





TECHNOLOGY

East Muskingum utilizes various educational online platforms/programs with students: Aleks, Study Island, Reading Eggs, ConnectEd, AR, STAR, and G Suite. G Suite consists of programs that allow teachers and students to create and share documents, spreadsheets, slide shows, and forms. Email accounts, with varying privileges dependent on grade level, are provided to students. Classroom teachers also use Google Classroom in order to communicate with their students and to provide them with an easy way to share files and electronically turn in assignments.

2022-2023 Techonolgy Updates...

- Purchased and installed seventy-six desktop computers to update our aging lab computers within the high school.
- Two hundred fifty-five Chromebooks were purchased and distributed throughout the district.
- Replaced three of our servers and a storage array as well as added a fourth server to our network.
- Implemented several additional cyber security measures including, but not limited to: multi-factor authentication for accounts that have access to sensitive information, rolling out new policies and procedures for account access, adding software to detect and contain threats.
- Obtained a safety grant that is allowing us to significantly upgrade our security camera system throughout the district. We are also utilizing this grant to upgrade our door access control system and add radios for better communication within our buildings.



ATHLETICS

The Ohio High School Athletic Association and EMSD requires that the following must be completed before a student is permitted to practice or try out for a sports team:

- The athlete must have a current physical on file in the office.
- The athlete and parent/guardian must fill out a Concussion Form.
- A current 2023-24 Emergency Medical Form must be completed and returned to the office.
- The Sudden Cardiac Arrest/Lindsay's Law Form must be signed by both the athlete and parent/guardian and returned to the office.
- Read the packet of information that explains the school athletic policy. The last page is the acknowledgement of risks, policies and procedures. This form must be signed by the parent/guardian and the athlete and returned to the office.

ACADEMIC REQUIREMENTS:

High School:

A student must be currently enrolled in a member school and have received passing grades in a minimum of five one credit courses or the equivalent, in the immediately preceding grading period. A student enrolled in the first grading period, after advancement from the eighth grade, must have passed a minimum of four of all subjects carried, is immediately preceding grading period in which the student was enrolled. If an OHSAA-eligible student's GPA is below a 1.300 for the preceding grading period, the student is ineligible and shall not participate in interscholastic events during the current grading period.

Middle School:

• A student enrolling in the seventh grade for the first time will be eligible for the first grading period regardless of the previous academic achievement. Thereafter, in order to be eligible, a student in grade 7 or 8 must be currently enrolled and must have been enrolled in the school immediately preceding grading period and received passing grades at the conclusion of that grading period in a minimum of four of all subjects carried. Each subject in which an EMMS student is enrolled will be assigned one (1) credit. If an OHSAA-eligible student's GPA is below a 1.300 for the preceding grading period, the student is ineligible and shall not participate in interscholastic events during the current grading period.

Attendance:

• Athletes must be in school at least one-half day in order to be eligible to practice or participate in a scheduled athletic event for that day. Athletes must be at school by 10:30 a.m. to be considered one-half day. Doctor appointments, funerals, and other emergency matters will not count against the athlete. Proactive communication for absences is encouraged.





CHILD FIND: A SEARCH FOR ALL CHILDREN WITH DISABILITIES

Every school district has the responsibility of seeking out and identifying children in need of special education services. Although school-age children are identified through each building's intervention assistance team and referral process, parents of children not yet enrolled who reside within the East Muskingum Local School District's boundaries may not be aware that services are available.

What does a disability mean?

- For ages birth to less than 10 a documented deficit in one or more of the following developmental areas: communication, vision, hearing, motor skills, social/emotional/behavioral functioning, self-help skills, and cognitive skills.
- For ages 5-21 identification of one or more of the following conditions: autism, hearing impairment including deafness, multiple disabilities, orthopedic impairment, other health impairment, emotional disturbance, specific learning disabilities, speech or language impairment, traumatic brain injury, and/or visual impairment including blindness.

PARTICIPATION IN FEDERAL ASSISTANCE PROJECT

The East Muskingum School District will again participate in the flow-thru Part B-IDEA Federal Assistance Project for the education of children with disabilities. Present plans for the money include employing special education staff (teachers, aides), a psychologist, medical evaluation services, and supplies and equipment for special education classrooms. GIFTED SCREENING AND IDENTIFICATION


Gifted and talented students are those in all cultural, socioeconomic, and ethnic backgrounds. East Muskingum Local School District accepts the Ohio definition of gifted according to section 3301-51-15 of the Ohio Revised Code: "Gifted" means students who perform or show potential for performing at remarkable high levels of accomplishment when compared to others of their age, experience, or environment and who are identified under division (A), (B), (C), or (D) of section 3324.03 of the Revised Code (as follows):

- Superior Cognitive Ability refers to those students demonstrating high cognitive functioning.
- Specific Academic Ability refers to those students who demonstrate high levels of achievement in one or more of the following areas: Mathematics, Science, Social Studies, Reading and/or Writing, or a combination of these skills.
- Creative Thinking Ability refers to those students having the ability to apply unique solutions to problems, innovative ideas, originality, outstanding imagination, innate curiosity, and the ability to solve problems using creative methods.
- Visual and Performing Arts Ability refers to those students demonstrating superior ability in one or more areas such as drawing, painting, sculpting, music, dance, and/or drama.

There are two phases in the process for screening and identifying gifted students. 1. Whole-grade screenings are administered in grades 2 (Superior Cognitive, Creative Thinking, Reading, and Math), grade 5 (Superior Cognitive, Creative Thinking) and 6 (Math) using the InView – A Test of Cognitive Abilities and the Terra Nova, Third Edition. Students in grades 3-5 also take the STAR test three times per year (reading). 2. Referrals for screening and identification of students in grades K-12 may be made throughout the school year. A parent, student, peer, teacher, administrator, guidance counselor, or school psychologist may refer a student for identification. Please contact your school to request a Referral for Testing Form. East Muskingum had 385 students identified as gifted in grades K-12 last year.




